The Great Temple in Petra is a massive archaeological complex built by the Nabataeans in the 1st century BCE. Located south of the Colonnaded Street, it served as a political and ceremonial center. The structure features a grand staircase, colonnaded courtyards, and a large audience hall. Its architecture blends Hellenistic and Nabataean styles.
