Falcata (curved single-edged sword used by the Iberians). It was intentionally bent during the funeral ritual. From the archaeological site of Alarcos (Necropolis of Alarcos II, Grave 16), Ciudad Real, Castilla-La Mancha, Spain. Iron Age (3rd-1st centuries BCE). In the collection of the Ciudad Real Museum.
